Subject: Implementation of Screening Process for Badged Employees and Airport Visitors

Sacramento International Airport (SMF) is preparing to implement a new screening process for all badged employees and airport visitors who move between public and secure areas. This initiative is being implemented to comply with the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) regulations, specifically the TSA National Amendment 23-02 on Aviation Worker Screening, which requires Category X, I, and II airports regulated under 49 CFR 1542.103(a) to conduct aviation worker screening.

While this screening process is not new, what is new is the addition of a third-party security company that will be conducting the screening at SMF. Starting in March, SMF will contract out services with a security company to perform screenings at access points leading from public areas to sterile and secure areas throughout Terminal A, Terminal B, and Concourse B. The screenings will be random and continuous and will involve both individuals and any accessible property they may have when entering these areas.

This security measure has been thoroughly vetted and approved by TSA to ensure the continued safety and security of all airport operations and to ensure it meets the regulations. The list of prohibited items will be attached to this letter.

Your cooperation is both necessary and appreciated as we implement these required enhanced security protocols. We encourage you to share this information with all employees at your business and we will be sharing more details in the coming weeks.

As a reminder, the airport conducts a monthly security and safety meeting, and we request that a representative from every section, business, or tenant at the airport

Prohibited Items

Prohibited/Permitted Items List for Employees at Sacramento International Airport

This document outlines the items that are prohibited or permitted for all badged and non-exempt employees while on duty, as well as for escorted individuals. Please note that this list is not exhaustive; additional items may be deemed prohibited based on regulatory requirements. Airport Management reserves the right to prohibit any items not specifically listed.

Important Note: For items marked with an asterisk (*), the screening officer is required to notify the SMF Communication Center. This will trigger notifications to TSA Management, Law Enforcement Officers, and the badged employee's supervisor or manager.

Consequences: Bringing prohibited items through the checkpoint or discovered within the Airport's SIDA or Sterile Areas may result in the suspension of the employee's badge and/or a security violation

Individuals with a yellow construction badge or a tool icon on a grey badge will be allowed to bring tools needed for their duties. Airport Management reserves the right to prohibit items at all times.
